SINLAKU RECOVERY UPDATE

As of Friday, May 1, 2026

The Joint Information Center (JIC) continues to coordinate response and recovery messaging following the impacts of Typhoon Sinlaku. Response agencies and partners are working around the clock to restore critical services and support affected communities across Saipan, Tinian, and Rota.

Saipan Restoration

System Status & Safety

- **Outages:** 15,624 customers remain without power, including 11,769 residential customers.
- **Infrastructure:** A total of 624 power poles are confirmed down.

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- **Assessments:** Guam Power Authority Assessment team (6 staff) arrived on 04/25/2026. The GPA team began preliminary damage assessments and coordination with CUC's Power Division engineers for the damage assessments completed.
- **Hazardous Materials:** EPA and FEMA support for hazardous material cleanup, including damaged transformers, has begun. As of 04/30/2026, there have been a total of 46 transformers retrieved.

Transmission & Feeder Updates

- **Feeder 1 & 3, Partial 1** to the Hospital was initially energized at 4:00PM on 04/19/2026 and remains online with the CUC grid on 04/22/2026 at 7:04PM and 100% load at 8:02PM.
 - Ongoing work performed at Power Plant No. 1. DE#1 was turned on 04/29/2026. Trip test was completed; however, load testing was postponed. Operators will continue the heating process of the bus bar and continuation of megger testing.
 - Work in Progress:
 - Repairing of the feeder riser termination to Power Plant no. 1 o Restoration work in progress from Smiling Cove Marina to the Mobil Storage facility.
- **Feeder 4:** Completed restoration work of clearing down wooden poles from Kagman Main Road. Completed restoration work at the KG 131 well, Kagman Booster overhead power lines to the generator. Completed the installation of 4 power poles on Feeder 4, 1st Partial from Power Plant no. 1 towards the Governor's Office.
 - Work in Progress:
 - FEMA Debris Task Force cleared access to all primary and secondary roads and cut down power poles.
 - Restoration work in progress to install 1 concrete power pole toward the CUC water facility.
- **Feeder 7:** Currently restringing and re-framing conductors at the As Matuis Water Wells.
 - Work in Progress:
 - Restringing and re-framing conductors on the 1st Partial. o Troubleshooting transformers in the As Matuis water wells.
- **Kiya 1:** Completed ongoing restoration work of restringing, reframing of conductors towards the Isley Water Wells.
 - Work in Progress:
 - Straightening of concrete power poles along Kiya1/2 double circuit.
- **Kiya 3:** Completed the restoration work at the S3 Lift Station, the facility has been isolated and ready to be energized. All pad-mounted transformers, customers who were isolated are awaiting the linecrew to open fuse cut-outs ready to be energized.
 - FEMA Debris Task Force cleared access to Chalan Kiya Road.

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- Restringing and framing of conductors on Beach Road and Chalan Msgr. Guerrero (former Atkins Kroll intersection) to the Garapan Fishing Base (near Horiguchi Building)
- **Kiya Substation:** Installation of FEMA generator completed on 04/28/2026.
- **Kiya 4:** Completed clearing of primary lines in Oleai/Falufula and Susupe (near Mt. Carmel Cathedral).
 - Work in Progress:
 - Restringing and reframing of primary lines on Kiya 4, 1st Partial (near NAPA Auto Parts to the Ada Gym).

Current Stats as of 04/30/2026: 624 poles down (46 concrete poles installed) | 552 transformers down | 15,624 total customers out (11,769 residences).

A contractor started repairs of side walls to prevent further water ingress into the switchgears and protect the generators-75% complete. ○ Diesel Engine (DE#1) was placed on a test run and automatically tripped due to an issue with the auxiliary power supply. Troubleshooting and corrective actions are ongoing.</p> <p>Equipment Recovery: Blower heating of Diesel Engine #2 generator windings are ongoing to support drying and restoration prior to return to service.</p>

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Tinian & Rota Restoration

- **Tinian:** Feeder assessments are 90% complete; **111 poles and 60 transformers are confirmed down as of 4/27/2026**. All feeders remain **offline** (1,059 customers out).
 - Number of down power poles: 111 as of 04/30/2026
 - Number of transformers: 60 as of 04/30/2026
 - Linear foot of down aluminum conductors: 53,164 of 556 conductors as of 04/30/2026
 - Number of damaged streetlights: 89 as of 04/30/2026
 - Number of residential weather heads damaged: 116 as of 04/30/2026
 - Rota line crew (5 staff) arrived on 04/27/2026 to assist with restoration.
 - **Work in Progress**
 - Ongoing retrieval of power meters from customers with generators and solar PV and debris removal.
 - Coordination meeting with USACE for debris clearing and assessment of damaged and leaking transformers for retrieval.
 - Feeder 3: Completed replacement & re-sagging 3.5 spans of 556 conductors, reframed wooden crossarms, replaced distribution hardware such as saddle Page 4 pins, insulators, machine bolts, washers and isolated customers on Feeder 3 towards the Maui 2 well.
 - Tinian Power Generation:
 - Major damages to power plant structure. Ongoing assessments, debris removal, clean-up of facility and securing engines & auxiliaries, switchgear, substation areas and security fence line repairs.
 - (No Change) CUC Saipan Engineering team assessed the Power Plant System on 04/20/2026 and 04/23/2026.
 - An additional assessment was performed on 04/25/2026.
 - Station power backup generator is operational and online as of 04/29/2026.



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- **Rota:** 100% of primary lines are energized on Feeders 1 and 2. Only 8 customers remain without power due to individual infrastructure damage.

WATER RESTORATION

Saipan Water

- **Current Production:** 8.9 million gallons/day (63% of production).
- **Customer Access:** 49% (4,311 of 8,758 customers).
- **Infrastructure:** 50% (68 of 138) of wells and facilities are online. 0 are on the CUC power grid.

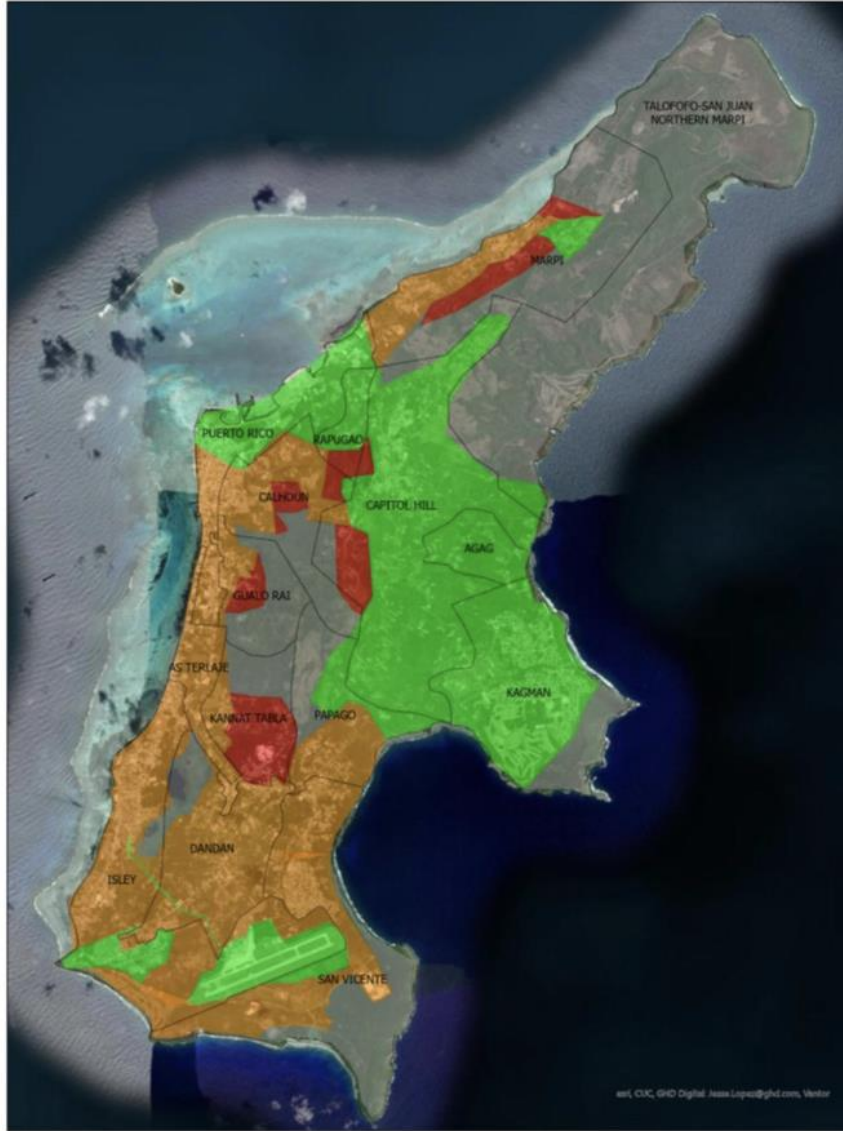
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Saipan Areas Receiving Water 4/30/2026 1400

Saipan Wastewater

- All CUC wastewater facilities remain without grid power; operations continue using emergency generators.

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- 12 lift stations running on CUC generators; 13 supported by portable generators (rotational use).
- Agingan Wastewater Treatment Plant operating on a FEMA-monitored and fueled generator; 5 facilities now operational with FEMA generators (A1, A3, A4, A5 Lift Stations and Sadog Tasi WWTP) as of 04/29.
- 6 lift stations currently bypassed using septic hauler trucks to prevent overflows.
- FOG (Fats, Oils, and Grease) program resumed; prioritizing damage assessments.
- 6 lift stations require weather head replacements (A9, A13, W8, S1, S8, T1); repairs pending.

Tinian Water Update

- **Water Service:** 98% online; 861 total customers (679 residential).
- **Damage Assessment:** Damages were observed on the roof of the Tinian Water Tank. Engineering performed a damage assessment for the tank and Maui 2 booster station on 04/29/2026. Pending cost estimate for the temporary and permanent repairs to the water tank roof.
- **System Operations:** Maui 2 well running on backup generator.

Rota Water Update

- **System Status:** 100% online; 863 total customers (681 residential).
- **Notice:** Precautionary Boil Water Notice was officially canceled as of April 22, 2026.
- **Infrastructure:** Solar chlorination system is non-operational; CUC is using an alternative chlorination source.

The Emergency Prescription Assistance Program

The Emergency Prescription Assistance Program, or EPAP is a federal program that helps uninsured people in disaster areas get the prescription drugs, vaccinations, medical supplies, and equipment that they need.

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Who qualifies? Answer: People without health insurance

People who qualify for EPAP can replace certain prescription medicine, medical supplies vaccines and certain pieces medical equipment that were:

- Lost or damaged while evacuating or because of the disaster
- Not refilled before disaster
- Lost or damaged at evacuation shelter

You are ineligible for the EPAP if you have

- Individual health insurance policy
- Employer-sponsored coverage
- Medicare
- Medicaid
- Other third-party coverage

If EPAP is activated in your area after a disaster, follow these steps for help:

- Make sure you qualify for EPAP
- Find out if your prescription or medical supplies are covered by EPAP
- Find a pharmacy participating in EPAP
- Give the pharmacy your medical information

EDUCATION

CNMI Public School System

- Schools Closed/Open: All CNMI Public School System employees will return to work on April 30, 2026, as campus cleanup and safety assessments continue. A Special Board of Education meeting is tentatively planned for May 1, 2026, to help determine next steps, including the timeline for students to return.

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- Some campuses remain in use as community shelters under the American Red Cross.
- **FOOD ASSISTANCE – STUDENT MEAL DISTRIBUTION**
 - The CNMI Public School System will begin grab-and-go meal distribution for students starting **May 4, 2026**, while schools remain closed due to Typhoon Sinlaku impacts.
 - Meals (breakfast and lunch combined) will be available **Monday through Friday, 0900–1300, while supplies last**, across designated sites on **Saipan, Tinian, and Rota**.
 - Students must present a valid school ID to receive meals (one meal set per ID). Limited distribution (up to two meal sets) will be available for vehicles without IDs. Private school and Head Start students are also eligible.

Northern Marianas College

- Northern Marianas College (NMC) has announced that the Spring 2026 term is ending early in response to the ongoing recovery from Super Typhoon Sinlaku.
- To further support students during these challenging times, NMC has activated a dedicated student hotline: (670) 285-2059/7651 available from Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. WhatsApp messaging is an available option as well. More information is available at www.marianas.edu.

Northern Marianas Technical Institute (NMTech)

- NMTech campus will be open for limited operations for cleaning purposes only as it was flooded and filled with mud. Selected Staff report back to work on Monday to gut ceiling and floor tiles and drywall that has been saturated. All staff will report on Wednesday for full campus clean up. Depending on results of clean up will determine opening of campus for emergency services utilization, i.e. culinary classroom.
- **Spring classes will be suspended until the latter part of June 2026.**

AIRPORT & PORT OPERATIONS

NO CHANGE FROM PREVIOUS SITREP

Saipan International Airport

Status:

- Daily (daylight) flights available on United Airlines, Micronesian Air Cargo/Connection Services (MACS) and Star Marianas Air (SMA) between Guam, Saipan, Tinian and Rota only. The Airport has no power and is powered by a generator. Limited running water.

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- Airport Runway Assessment: Due to damage to navigational aids (navaids), flights are limited to DAYTIME operations only. Federal Aviation Authority (FAA) representatives are on-island to assess the damages to the navaids and the Air Traffic Control Tower. Parts are on order but may take time for it to arrive on the island.
- Additional assistance is being provided by staff from the Guam International Airport Authority to assess the apron and taxiway lights, runway signs and miscellaneous items around the terminal buildings.
- Loading Bridges (Jetways): All six bridges sustained damage, however, Jetway #2 is now operational. Jetway #6 is being repaired now. Two stair-carts will be used as a backup; increasing our enplaning and deplaning to three.
- Perimeter Fence: The perimeter fence line repairs are at 45% complete. Phase 2 is to fabricate chain link gates for all three (3) terminal gates.

- United Airlines resuming daily Guam service (effective April 23, 2026)
 - Arrival: 8:50 AM
 - Departure: 9:55 AM
- MACS and Star Marianas Air (SMA) operating daytime commuter and cargo flights
- Additional airline partners pending confirmation

Capacity & Operations:

- Flights limited to daytime operations only (due to damaged navigational aids)
- 1 operational jetway (#2); Jetway #6 under repair
- 2 stair carts available as backup
- Additional assistance is being provided by staff from the Guam International Airport Authority

Francisco Manglona Borja/Tinian International Airport

- Open with restrictions
- Humanitarian flights only
- Daytime operations only

Benjamin Taisacan Manglona International Airport (Rota)

- Open and operational
- Able to receive flights

SEAPORT OPERATIONS

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Current Status

- The Port of Saipan is open for commercial traffic and cargo operations without restrictions. All cargo operations shall be conducted at the discretion and under the coordination of Saipan Stevedore Company and the vessel agent.
The backup generator at the main port has been installed and assessments to the dock lights are underway to see if they are conducive for night operations.
- The Port of Tinian is under Limited Port Heavy Weather Condition (PHWC) WHISKEY. Port facilities are currently open to all commercial traffic. Operations are limited to DAYLIGHT only.
- Rota West Harbor: Due to potential hazards at Berths 1 and 2, the U.S. Coast Guard has ordered a suspension of all cargo delivery loading and discharge at the commercial berths.

Navigation Safety

- Mariners are advised to use caution when entering or departing waterways

PUBLIC SAFETY

General Updates

- All beaches on Saipan and Tinian are now open; however, CNMI DPS advises the public to remain cautious as debris may still be present in the water.
- All beaches on Rota remain closed
- All non-essential service fees are temporarily suspended during the recovery period

Traffic Safety Notice for Saipan

Due to dark intersections and non-functioning traffic signals, motorists are advised to follow these guidelines:

- Complete Stop: Come to a full stop at all intersections
- Right of Way:
 - First vehicle to arrive proceeds first

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- If arriving at the same time, yield to the vehicle on your right
- Left Turns: Yield to oncoming traffic unless you have established the right of way
- Reduce Speed: Slow down well in advance of intersections
- Stay Alert: Treat all non-functioning signals as a 4-way stop
- Use Signals: Clearly indicate your driving intentions

Pedestrian Safety

- Exercise extra caution, especially at night
- Be aware that street lighting may be limited or unavailable

Security Operations

- Routine patrols are being conducted at FEMA generators located at water well sites.
- These patrols are aimed at preventing tampering and safeguarding critical infrastructure essential to water distribution.

Public Services

- The Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) remains closed until further notice.
- All driver's license and registration fees are waived during the closure period.

DPS remains actively engaged in maintaining public safety, protecting critical resources, and supporting recovery operations across the island.

FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

Food Assistance (NAP) Update

DCCA's Nutrition Assistance Program (NAP) has received USDA approval for emergency waivers to support households impacted by Typhoon Sinlaku.

- **63% Automatic Benefit Replacement:** All active April 2026 NAP recipients will receive a 63% replacement of benefits. No application required; funds will be credited to EBT cards within **5–10 business days**.
- **Hot Food Waiver:** NAP benefits can be used to purchase **hot, prepared foods** from authorized retailers **through May 27, 2026**, territory-wide.

Eligibility Requirements

FEMA assistance is available to individuals who meet the following criteria:

- U.S. citizens
- Non-citizen nationals
- Qualified aliens

Types of Assistance Available

Eligible residents may receive assistance for:

- Temporary housing needs
- Repairs to owner-occupied homes
- Personal property losses
- Medical expenses
- Funeral expenses
- Other serious disaster-related needs not covered by insurance or other sources

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U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Disaster Loan Programs

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is offering low-interest disaster loans to homeowners, renters, businesses, and nonprofits impacted by Super Typhoon Sinlaku.

Homeowners and Renters

Eligible residents may apply for loans to:

- Repair or replace primary residences (up to \$500,000)
- Replace personal property, including vehicles (up to \$100,000)
- Access low fixed interest rates with terms up to 30 years
- Receive no payments and no interest for 12 months
- Fund mitigation improvements to reduce future disaster risk

Businesses and Nonprofits

Businesses and nonprofit organizations may apply for loans to:

- Repair or replace physical property damage
- Cover financial losses related to disaster impacts
- Access funding up to \$2 million
- Benefit from low fixed interest rates and extended repayment terms
- Support rebuilding and mitigation improvements

Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL)

Small businesses and nonprofits experiencing revenue loss due to the disaster may apply for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) to:

- Meet ordinary and necessary financial obligations
- Maintain operations during recovery
- Access loans up to \$2 million
- Receive no payments and no interest for 12 months
